Notes about the Service

Hymns: 'Great hymns serve as praise, prayer, and proclamation in the context of worship. They say something we still need to hear, something we must believe, sing, and share. They often paraphrase a psalm, distill the teaching of a specific scriptural passage, or relate a doctrine of other spiritual truth by drawing on several biblical texts. Hymns are not emotionless. They make demands on the whole person—on the heart, soul, and mind...While some hymn texts and tunes are ancient, hymns are not antiques' [Paul S. Jones, 'Hymnody in a Post-Hymnody World,' in *Give Praise to God: A Vision for Reforming Worship*, 224].

Ernest W. Shurtleff wrote **Lead On, O King Eternal** for the graduation ceremony at Andover Theological Seminary, where he was a member of the class of 1888.

Most Christians all over the world confess their faith in worship using one of two ancient, historical creeds: **The Apostles' Creed** and the **Nicene Creed**. When we confess the faith using one of these creeds, we not only confess those things we believe, but we remind ourselves that Christianity is a lot older than we (our faith is grounded in history) and a lot broader than we (these articles of faith are shared by all who have any claim to be Christian throughout two millennia and all over the world). Confessing the faith helps us get past the myopia and arrogance of thinking of ourselves as though we were the first or only Christians in the world, or of treating the Faith as something we can tinker with to "make it our own." The Faith we confess is a **received** faith, a faith handed down to us from age to age by the Church.

Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing was written by 23-year-old Robert Robinson (1735-1790), who was converted as a teenager under the preaching of George Whitefield at a meeting Robinson and his friends attended for the purpose of "scoffing at the poor, deluded Methodists." Several years later he was ordained a minister in the Methodist Church in England.
