Notes about the Service

Call to Worship: Biblical worship is always a response to God's gracious
revelation of himself to his people. He takes the initiative to come to us in grace
and seek us before we ever respond to him. Therefore, our worship services begin

with a scriptural "call to worship." The content comes from the Bible and is
pronounced by the minister or sung by the choir. In the call to worship we are
reminded that God always takes the initiative. He always comes toward us first in
grace. The worship we offer is a response to his gracious call.

The Apostles' Creed: Dr. D. James Kennedy writes about *The Apostles' Creed*:
"It does not argue. It throws down the gauntlet. It is an affirmation, a declaration.
It is a manifesto of a Messiah who has come to conquer the world. And, of course,
it should never be mumbled or even merely recited. To do it right, it ought to be
shouted...because upon the great truths that are averred in this magnificent creed
men are called to stake their lives. In fact, in various parts of the world today men
and women are doing precisely that: They are staking their lives on these truths."

"So then, brothers, stand firm and hold to the traditions that you were taught by
us, either by our spoken word or by our letter" (2 Thessalonians 2:15). Saying *The
Apostles' Creed* helps us stand firm and hold to the teachings of the Bible. We
may enter worship weary and worn-down, with weak faith. As we say the Creed,
we are strengthening ourselves in the Lord our God.

Hymns: 'Great hymns serve as praise, prayer, and proclamation in the context of
worship. They say something we still need to hear, something we must believe,
sing, and share. They often paraphrase a psalm, distill the teaching of a specific
scriptural passage, or relate a doctrine of other spiritual truth by drawing on
several biblical texts. Hymns are not emotionless. They make demands on the
whole person—on the heart, soul, and mind...While some hymn texts and tunes
are ancient, hymns are not antiques' [Paul S. Jones, 'Hymnody in a Post-
Hymnody World,' in *Give Praise to God: A Vision for Reforming Worship*, 224].
