Notes about the service

Holy! Holy! Holy! was published in 1827, a year after the death of its author, Reginald Heber, who had served as Bishop of Calcutta, overseeing Anglican parishes in the British colonies of India, Ceylon (Sri Lanka), and Australia. Heber wrote this hymn for use on this particular day—Trinity Sunday, eight weeks after Easter. The living and true God whom we worship is God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit—one God in three persons, which we have come to call *The Holy Trinity*. The worship we offer is the communion of the Holy Trinity with us his people. Life in Christ unites us with the Trinity, gives us knowledge of the Father's love and the gifts of the Holy Spirit. **Holy God, We Praise Your Name** is based on the 4th century *Te Deum*:

We praise thee, O God; we acknowledge thee to be the Lord.
All the earth doth worship thee, the Father everlasting.
To thee all Angels cry aloud; the Heavens, and all the Powers therein.
To thee Cherubim and Seraphim continually do cry,
Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts;
Heaven and earth are full of the Majesty: of thy glory.
The glorious company of the Apostles praise thee.
The goodly fellowship of the Prophets praise thee.
The noble army of Martyrs praise thee.
The holy Church throughout all the world : doth acknowledge thee;
The Father of an infinite Majesty;
Thine honourable, true and only Son;
Also the Holy Ghost the Comforter.
Thou art the King of Glory O Christ. Thou art the everlasting Son of the Father.
When thou took upon thee to deliver man thou didst not abhor the Virgin's womb.
When thou hadst overcome the sharpness of death thou didst open the Kingdom of Heaven to all believers.
Thou sittest at the right hand of God in the glory of the Father.
We believe that thou shalt come to be our Judge.
We therefore pray thee, help thy servants whom thou hast redeemed with thy precious blood.
Make them to be numbered with thy Saints in glory everlasting.
O Lord, save thy people and bless thine heritage.
Govern them and lift them up for ever.
Day by day we magnify thee; and we worship thy Name ever, world without end.
Vouchsafe, O Lord, to keep us this day without sin.
O Lord, have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us.
O Lord, let thy mercy lighten upon us as our trust is in thee.
O Lord, in thee have I trusted let me never be confounded.
