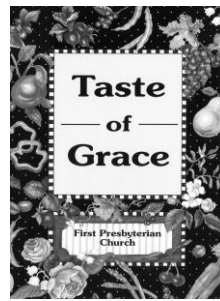

Thank you to all the ladies in the church who participated in the **Ava Lacey Twelve Days of Christmas**. There were plenty of gifts, and it was a huge success.

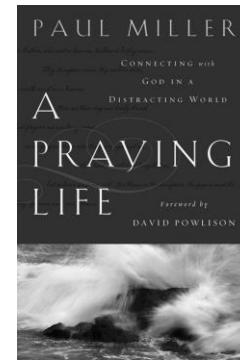

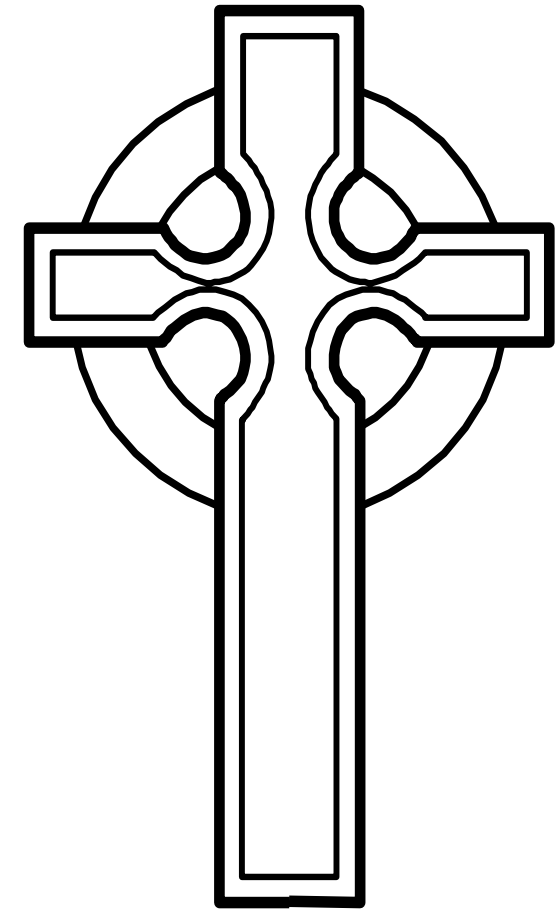
