Notes about the service:

As we sing **Holy! Holy! Holy!** we echo the praises of heaven (Isaiah 6:4; Revelation 4:8). Why is the Lord God described as *holy* three times rather than once? A three-fold repetition in Hebrew is the strongest superlative. In other words, no one and nothing is as holy as God. Nothing compares to him—'perfect in power, in love and purity.'

The Lord's Supper: We believe that we need every help that the Bible allows to remember and celebrate the gospel. The Lord's Supper is a sacrament—a tangible, physical way that God has provided for us to proclaim and celebrate what he has done through the life, death, and resurrection of his Son, Jesus Christ.

The Lord's Table is for those who are trusting in Jesus Christ. Thus, we invite to the Lord's Table all those who trust in Jesus Christ alone for their salvation as he is offered in the Gospel and who have joined themselves to the body of Christ, his Church. If you are not a believer in Christ who has identified yourself with his Church, don't come to the table. Rather, wait, think, pray, repent, and believe the Gospel of Jesus Christ. One of our pastors or elders would be glad to talk with you further about what it means to follow Christ.

Parents will want to take note that we do not practice paedo-communion (infants or young children who have not yet taken membership vows partaking of the Lord's Supper) at First Presbyterian Church. Young people who have answered the five questions of church membership before the Session and thus have become communicant members of First Presbyterian Church (or the equivalent at some other Gospel-believing church) are invited to the table.

The Ruling Elders of our church assist in the distribution of the elements of the Supper as a visible manifestation of their pastoral care of the flock.

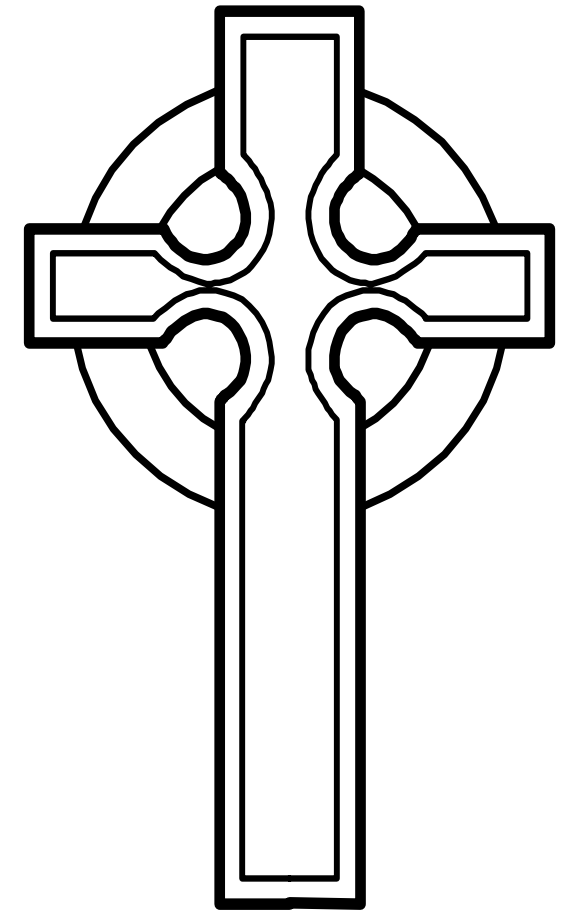
