Notes about the service:

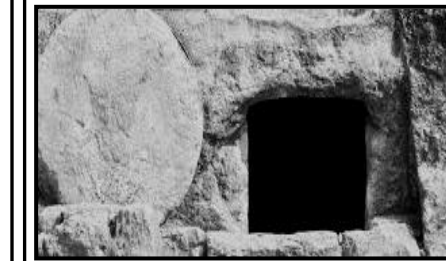
The Apostles' Creed is the oldest and most popular creed of the church, and has greatly influenced the other creeds and confessions written throughout church history. The Apostles' Creed is not a direct production of the apostles themselves, but is meant to be understood as a summary of apostolic teaching. The Apostles' Creed we have today is not the Creed in its original form. The shorter and older form was known as the Old Roman Creed. It was constructed in Greek around AD 140 and in Latin around AD 390. The present form of the Apostles' Creed, which is both longer and more recent, was probably not compiled until the middle of the 5th century, but the message of the two Creeds is basically the same. Initially, the Old Roman Creed was a baptismal confession made by converts at their baptism. In that regard, the Creed served an important need in the early church.

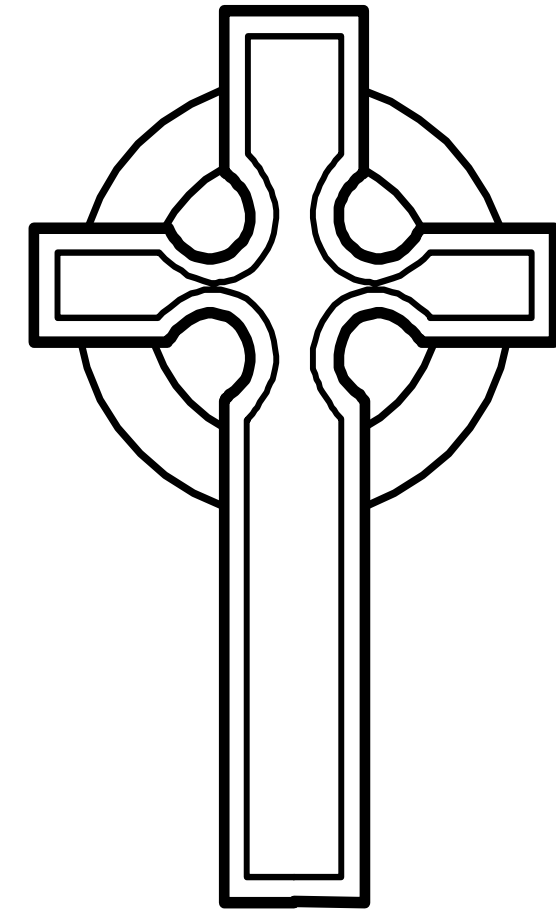
