O! Let the nations sing the fame of Christ the Lamb who once was slain!

He is risen! He is risen!

Now we await the coming day when all those raised in Christ will say:

Notes about the service:

"Every time we baptize an infant we bear witness that salvation is from God, that we cannot do any good thing to secure it, that we all enter the Kingdom of heaven therefore as little children, who do not do, but are done for" (B.B. Warfield). **Baptism is a covenant sign.** That is, **it points to and confirms a gracious promise of God to His people.** Our *Larger Catechism* tells us that "Baptism is a sacrament of the New Testament, in which Christ has commanded the application of water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, to be a sign and seal of union with himself, of forgiveness of sins by his blood, regeneration by his Spirit, adoption, and resurrection unto everlasting life; and whereby those who are baptized are solemnly admitted into the visible church, and enter into an open and professed engagement to be wholly and only the Lord's." We are thankful for the entire Sims family and pray that Aaron will love and serve the Lord all the days of his life.

Holy! Holy! Holy! was published in 1827, one year after the death of its author, Reginald Heber, who had served as Bishop of Calcutta, overseeing Anglican parishes in the British colonies of India, Ceylon (Sri Lanka), and Australia. Heber wrote this hymn for liturgical use on this particular day—Trinity Sunday, eight weeks after Easter.

How Deep the Father's Love for Us comes from contemporary British songwriter Stuart Townend, who explained, "I'd been meditating on the cross, and in particular what it cost the Father to give up his beloved Son to a torturous death on a cross. And what was my part in it? Not only was it my sin that put him there, but if I'd lived at that time, it would probably have been me in that crowd, shouting with everyone else 'crucify him'. It just makes his sacrifice all the more personal, all the more amazing, and all the more humbling."

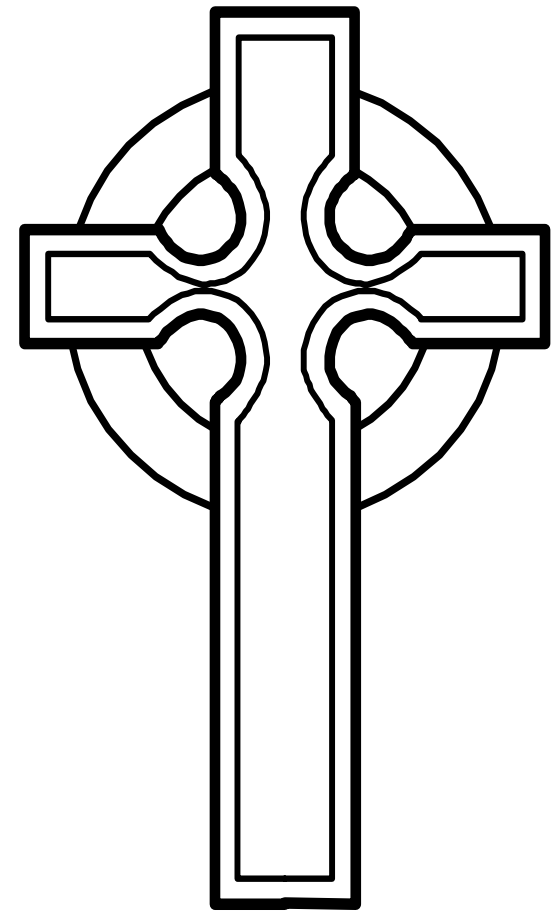
