Notes about the service:

Opening Hymn:

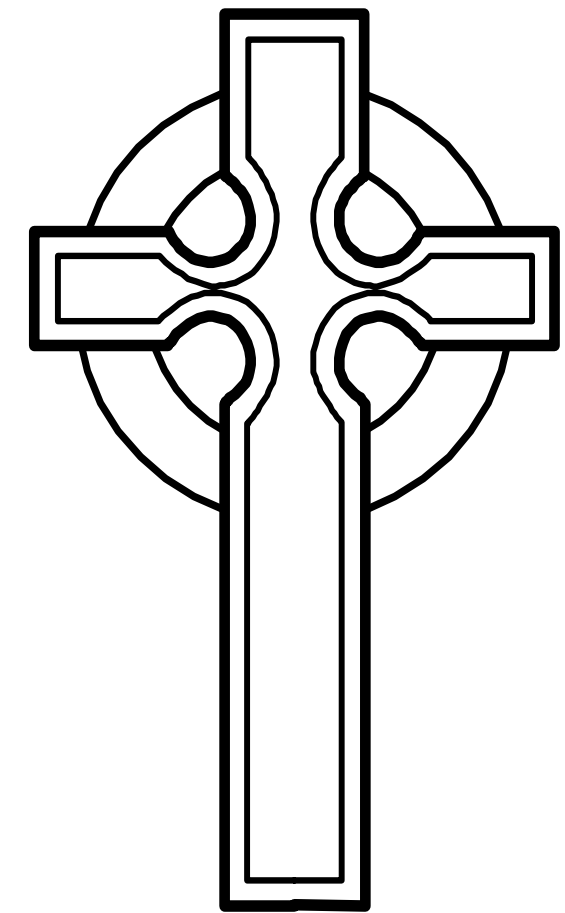
