Notes about the service:

The Lord's Supper: We believe that God has provided in the Lord's Supper a great help for us to remember and celebrate the gospel. The Lord's Supper is a sacrament—a tangible, physical way in which God confirms to us all the benefits of the life, death, and resurrection of Christ Jesus.

The Lord's Table is for those who are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for their salvation. So we invite to the Lord's Table everyone who trusts in Jesus Christ alone for their salvation as he is offered in the Gospel and who is a member in good standing in the body of Christ, his Church. If you are not a believer in Christ who has identified yourself with his Church, don't come to the table. Rather, wait, pray, repent, and believe the Gospel of Jesus Christ. One of our pastors or elders would be glad to talk with you further about what it means to follow Christ.

Parents will want to take note that we do not practice paedo-communion (infants or young children who have not yet taken membership vows partaking of the Lord's Supper) at First Presbyterian Church. Young people who have answered the five questions of church membership before the Session and thus have become communicant members of First Presbyterian Church (or the equivalent at some other Gospel-believing church) are invited to the table.

The Ruling Elders of our church assist in the distribution of the elements of the Supper as a symbol of their pastoral care of the flock.



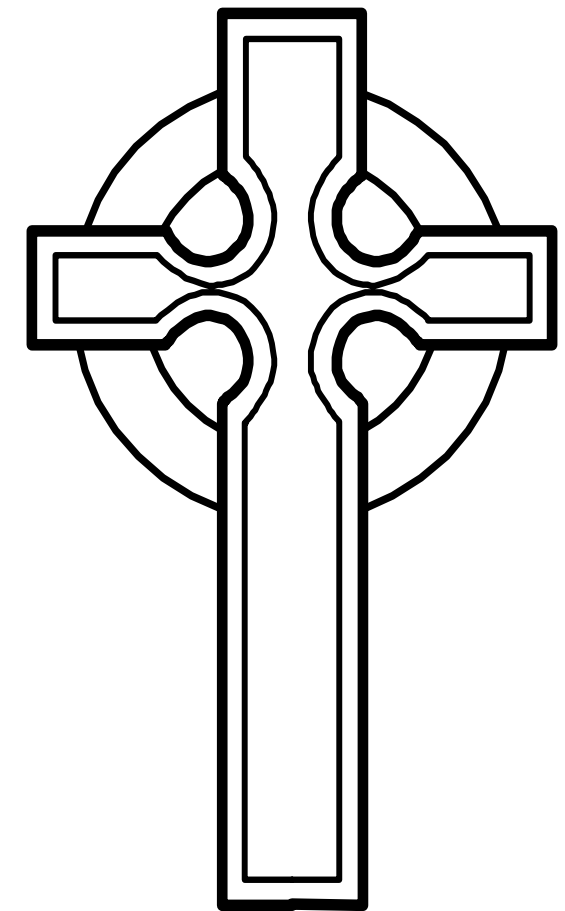
