Notes about the service:

Vows of Membership: *Every Christian who believes the Bible should become a member of a local church, wherever he or she lives, for however long, as quickly as possible.* "The very word *membership* is of Christian origin, but it has been taken over by the world and emptied of all meaning. ... I am afraid that when we describe a man as 'a member of the Church' we usually mean nothing Pauline; we mean only that he is a unit—that he is one more specimen of some kind of things as X and Y and Z." (C.S. Lewis, *The Weight of Glory*, 1949)

PCA Membership Vows

1. Do you acknowledge yourselves to be sinners in the sight of God, justly deserving His displeasure, and without hope save in [i.e., except for] His sovereign mercy?
2. Do you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God, and Savior of sinners, and do you receive and rest upon Him alone for salvation as He is offered in the gospel?
3. Do you now resolve and promise, in humble reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit, that you will endeavor to live as becomes the followers of Christ?
4. Do you promise to support the Church in its worship and work to the best of your ability?
5. Do you submit yourselves to the government and discipline of the Church, and promise to study its purity and peace?

The Sacrament of Baptism: "Every time we baptize an infant we bear witness that salvation is from God, that we cannot do any good thing to secure it, that we all enter the Kingdom of heaven therefore as little children, who do not do, but are done for" (B.B. Warfield). **Baptism is a covenant sign.** That is, **it points to and confirms a gracious promise of God to His people.** Our *Larger Catechism* tells us that "Baptism is a sacrament of the New Testament, in which Christ has commanded the application of water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, to be a sign and seal of union with himself, of forgiveness of sins by his blood, regeneration by his Spirit, adoption, and resurrection unto everlasting life; and whereby those who are baptized are solemnly admitted into the visible church, and enter into an open and professed engagement to be wholly and only the Lord's." We are thankful for Eva and for the entire Davis family and pray that she will love and serve the Lord all the days of her life.

Next Lord's Day: Dr. Paul Chinchon of African Bible College will preach in Morning Worship.



Paul and Laura Chinchon

have been missionaries with African Bible College in Malawi and Uganda for 21 years. Paul is the Director of the college in Lilongwe, Malawi, and oversees the operations of the mission's four support ministries — the ABC Community Clinic, the ABC Christian Academy (acting Superintendent), Radio ABC with stations in Lilongwe and Mzuzu, and the college's Evangelistic Outreach Program, which mobilizes students and faculty into ministry teams that reach out to local hospitals, orphanages, villages and schools. Laura is the ABC Christian Academy's Curriculum Coordinator and Assistant Head and also teaches typing (keyboarding) to incoming Freshmen students at the African Bible College. Laura also served as the Dean of Admissions at the African Bible College from 1996-2005 until the position was turned over to a Malawian, Maggie Madimbo.

After ministering with African Bible College in Malawi for 15 years the Chinchon's moved to Kampala, Uganda, in August, 2004, where ABC was in the process of opening its third Christian college. Paul's job was to oversee construction of the 12 buildings needed to open the college in September of 2005 and help set up the administration. The Chinchon's returned to Malawi in 2007 and continue leading the ABC mission team and ministries in Lilongwe.

The purpose of African Bible College is to train Christian leaders for the evangelical missions and churches of Africa. The unique vision of ABC is to train Christian leaders at the university level on the African continent and in the African context — offering African church leaders quality Christian education in their own countries.

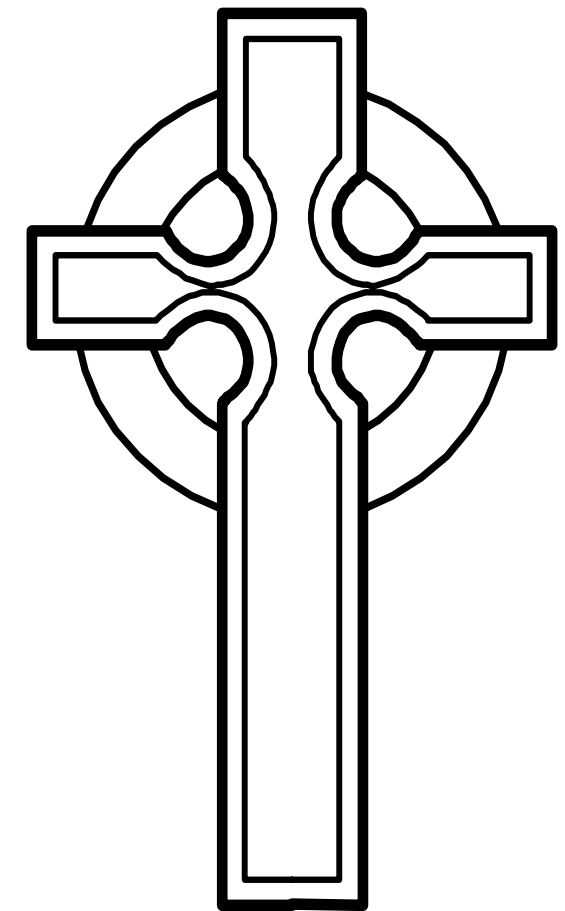
