### October 4: The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper

We are using pre-filled, individually sealed "all-in-one" Communion sets.

The wafer is sealed separately in the upper compartment. Carefully pull back the clear plastic cover by the tab. (Warning: the wafer doesn't taste very good). Underneath the wafer is a separate sealed compartment filled with 100% grape juice.



When you have finished partaking, place the empty container in the pew rack.

When the service ends, please place the empty container in a receptacle that will be provided in each aisle, so that no one else will have to touch the container after you.
